2022 in Review

Committee Chairs: Jim Alexander-Scholarship and Membership; Judy Hills—Web Master and Newsletter Editor.

On August 24th our Chapter was officially incorporated as a nonprofit with the State of North Carolina.

January 12th Board Meeting via Zoom. We approved the 2022 Budget and set a calendar of events for 2022.

February 19th we had a workshop and tour of Gary Lowell's Boat Shop in Greensboro.



March 5th there was a chapter workshop at John Justice's Piglet—to do a bottom job on Jeff Gel's Sweet Pea. Several members of the Smith Mountain Lake ACBS Chapter joined us.
