





A Blast From the Past—Bob Banta

I don't know if you subscribe to Classic Boating or not but here is some interesting information for you and perhaps to share with the SML chapter. On page 1 of the July/August issue is a two page picture circa 1940 of three young couples aquaplaning. The young man on the white aquaplane is undoubtedly my father (1920 – 2018). The picture is taken on Lake Mohawk NJ, one lake over from the more public Lake Hopatcong. My grandparents built one of the first homes on the soonto-be lake. Most of the west shore of Lake Mohawk is gated. I contacted the magazine attempting to learn more about the source of the image but they either didn't know or weren't willing to reveal it. The picture on page 3 is likely of the only marina on the lake.
















Chapter Burgees

What are the ACBS Definitions of Antique or Classic Boat?

Historic: Any boat built up to and including 1918 **Antique:** Any boat built between 1919 and 1942 **Classic:** Any boat built between 1943 and 1975

Late Classic: Any boat built 1976 to 25 years prior to the current year.

Contemporary: Any wooden boat built within the last 25 years.

Boats classified as Historic up through Late Classic will be judged separately as Preserved, Restored or Resto-Mod

Resto-Mod: Any historic, antique, classic or late classic boat that has been restored and modified with non-original parts and technology.
