Chapter Business Meeting 25 January 2023 via Zoom at 7:00 PM

President Jeff Martinson presided over the meeting. A quorum was established. All Board members were present with the exception of Treasurer Kevin Leiner. The following are the key points and decisions made at the meeting. <u>Click here</u> to read the full set of minutes (draft).

Finances: We started 2022 with a bank balance of \$6,167.65 and ended with \$7,493.71. We income of \$2,750 and expenses of \$1,423.94. We came in under budget for the year. We worked on the 2023 Budget, but did not finalize it.

CFCC Scholarships: We discussed some issues with this program. Currently the CFCC Foundation is holding \$2,000 of our Chapter's funds for scholarships that have not been awarded yet. We did not spend the \$1,025 that was in the budget for this purpose. We decided to change the term of this line item on the 2023 budget from "scholarships" to "community service" which gives us more latitude for spending. Judy and Alan Hills will being seeing CFCC Foundation members at an event on 2/2 and will discuss the situation with them.

ACBS: Judy and Alan Hills will be attending the Sunnyland Boat Festival in March. Alan will be Jeff's proxy to attend a Chapter President's event being hosted by the ACBS Chapter Development Committee (CDC). Judy will be at the ACBS Board meeting as a member of the CDC.

Club merchandise/SWAG: We kicked around some ideas, but nothing definitive was decided.

Jeff is going to coordinate a meeting with Dan Bixler (we decided to give him a role: Creative Director) and Mike Triplett to review our options.

Membership: It was suggested that when you renew your ACBS membership that you consider adding secondary membership in the Blue Ridge Chapter and/or the Smith Mountain Lake Chapter as we attend events put on by both these chapters.

Chapter 2023 Calendar of Events: We finalized our major events for the year. We hope members will not only attend, but that they will also suggest/lead pop-up (last minute) events like workshops, work sessions, and boat runs.

2023 Chapter Boat Show: Chair Alan Hills said that we are all set to hold the show at Blackbeard Sailing Club on September 30th with a cruise and get together on September 29th. See next page for details. We agreed to donate \$200 to BSC as a thank you for allowing us to use their facility at no charge.

2022 Annual Report: The Board is working on content for this report.

ACBS EOY Chapter Report: Jeff indicated that he has submitted our chapter's information. He rated our chapter as "Excellent."

Hey Gang! We have been approved by Blackbeard Sailing Club to hold our chapter boat show there for the third consecutive year. This year's dates will be September 29th and 30th. We will be following the same basic format as last year featuring a Friday afternoon cruise on the Neuse River, Friday evening catered social, and Saturday show.

The show hours on Saturday will be the same: 10:00 AM to 2 PM. This allows those who have to do some traveling to get an early start on the trip home. We are also going to move the land display area into the infield of the circular driveway to enhance our visibility to the public.

We are very fortunate to have use of this wonderful facility located in the Fairfield Harbour area of New Bern, NC. Our chapter and the Smith Mountain Lake Chapter frequently collaborate on events.




Need Help With Your Boat Project?



What are the ACBS Definitions of Antique or Classic Boat?

Historic: A boat built up to and including 1918

Antique: A boat built between 1919 and 1942, inclusive

Classic: A boat built between 1943 and 1975, (any material)

Late Classic: A boat built 1976 to 25 years prior to the current year.

Contemporary: Any wooden boat built within the last 25 years.

Boats classified as Historic up through Late Classic will be judged separately as Pre-

served or Restored boats. For more information click here.
