Minutes of Meeting February 23, 2019

19 Members and their spouses/ significant others met for lunch at Moonrakers in Beaufort at 11:30 AM

At 1:00 PM we toured the Moores' Marine facility at Jarrett Bay.

President Alan Hills called the meeting to order at 2:30 PM.

President Hills thanked Jim Moores for allowing us to tour his boat restoration and boat building facility at Jarrett Bay. Jim had discussed cold molding of hulls and the design of a new boat he is building. Jim gave attendees sunglasses and a Moores' Marine pin.

Alan announced that the chapter members had voted to change the name of the chapter to the NC Coastal and Piedmont Chapter. The proposed name has been sent to national. It will not be official until it is approved by ACBS national at their next Board meeting on March 21st. We will need a new logo and a new masthead for our website and newsletter.

to have a tour of Lowell's Boats.
Owner Gary Lowell will talk about how to pick a brush, brush techniques and tip & roll. These are subjects that he teaches at the WoodenBoat School in Maine.
We will meet for lunch at a nearby restaurant—still to be determined. Gary is holding an open house for others as well. Gary and Alan discussed our chapter inviting the Blue Ridge Chapter and the Smith Mountain Lake Chapter to attend as well.

Alan reminded everyone that both the newsletter and the chapter website will have information on events—so there is no need to call him. Alan reviewed some upcoming events: June event at Blackbeard Sailing Club will need a new venue because of hurricane damage repairs that will be going on at that time. We are invited to bring our boats for land display at the Oriental Boat show April 12-14. May 4th is the Maritime Museum boat show in Beaufort—we will have an area for land display of club boats. We discussed the possibility of a May weekend outing at Lake James in Nebo-3 hours west of Raleigh.




