

CHAPTER SLATE OF OFFICERS FOR 2021

We thank VP Jeff Martinson for his work in pulling together this slate of officers for 2021. And to those who volunteers to take office, if elected. We welcome other nominations—and you can nominate yourself—so don't be shy if you are interested in serving. New blood is welcome! The following is from our current bylaws:

The Annual Meeting of the Chapter shall be held in September or October upon at least 30 days-notice of time, date, and place to the general membership, at which a quorum shall consist of those in attendance who are eligible voting members. (NOTE: Due to COVID-19 our schedule is a little off this year.)

- 1. Directors: Directors shall be elected to a term of two years, with two directors being elected one year and three directors being elected in the subsequent year (staggered terms). Directors may serve unlimited number of terms.
- 2. President: The President shall be elected annually for a term of one year and shall not serve more than three consecutive terms as President.
- 3. Vice President: The Vice President shall be elected annually for a term of one year, and shall not serve more than three consecutive terms as Vice President.
- 4. Secretary and Treasurer: The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected annually for a term of one year with unlimited successive terms.

Remember that spouses are considered members and as such are eligible to vote and hold office! Write in candidates are encouraged, but they must agree to serve if elected.

What are the ACBS Definitions of Antique or Classic Boat?

Historic: A boat built up to and including 1918

Aptique: A boat built between 1919 and 1943 in

Antique: A boat built between 1919 and 1942 inclusive

Classic: A boat built between 1943 and 1975 (any material)

Late Classic: A boat built 1976 to 25 years prior to the current year.

Boats classified as Historic up through Late Classic will be judged separately as Preserved or Restored boats. For more information <u>click here.</u>
